KONOS KIDS (Grades 4-6)

Tuesdays, Wednesdays, or Thursdays (choose one) **9:15 - 2:45**
After children receive at-home, informal character training and basic reading and writing skills (from grade K-3), they are ready for a more structured program. This program is for children who can read and relate well within a small group of other students. Norma Jacobson, Holly Hampton, and Gina Bledsoe provide a weekly structure for the family's at-home schooling. In class they meet to account for assignments, do exciting hands-on activities, and interact around KONOS units (science, history, geography, art, music, literature, writing, grammar, and Bible.)

KONOS JUNIORS (Grades 7-8)

Tuesdays, Wednesdays, or Thursdays (choose one) **9:15 - 2:45**
This program can be described as "classical plus." Elizabeth Fry and Tiffany McBryde teach students who are ready for a more rigorous, structured program. The focus in this program is learning how to be successful students. They practice self-management, writing, and reasoning skills which will prepare them for KONOS Academy high school. The academic focus is world cultures — the history, art, geography, religion, traditions, and daily life. With each culture, students read related literature, do hands-on activities, and work together on challenging projects. Vocabulary, grammar, and critical thinking lessons support the students' reasoning and writing skills.



KONOS ACADEMY (Grades 9-12)

Tuesdays, Wednesdays, or Thursdays (choose one) **9:00 - 2:45**

With sufficient training in reading, writing, and reasoning, KONOS students are now ready for high school, college-prep courses. Rather than piecemeal courses, students immerse themselves in a historical period, which integrates all their courses, while receiving accredited grades for each course. The focus of 2019-20 is the Age of Exploration (Reformation to Romantic).

American History (1 credit)

Dr. Charles Thaxton

The theme for 2019-20 is EXPLORATION. We navigate through the world, focusing on the roots of American history. Students learn by lecture, personal research, and group presentations.

American Literature and Composition (1 credit)

Suzanne Buchanan, Cindy Johnson, John Lee, Joanne Lee, Dr. Sharon Sellers, Carole Thaxton

English literature is coordinated with the history units. We will read and analyze a wide variety of plays, poems, historical fiction, novels and speeches based upon this period. Students practice vocabulary, grammar, and composition skills each week.

American Government (.5 credit)

Ray Lewis

While studying the founding of America, students will be immersed in American government (both state and federal).

Art and Music Appreciation (.5 credit)

During the Romantic Period, a swell of music and art characterized Western civilization. Students will learn varieties of styles as well as specific works of art and music that reflect the culture of the period.

Speech/Drama III (.5 credit)

Joanne Lee, Kim Pollard, Savannah Pollard

Every year KONOS students participate in a variety of speeches and a major theatrical performance.
